Kitchen Utensil Holder



Materials

- 8 feet long 1x8 Lumber - **1 Piece**
- 1 ½" Brad nails - **minimum 25 nails**
- General Purpose Wood glue

Tools Needed

- Safety Glasses
- Pencil and tape measure
- Speed Square
- Miter/Chop Saw/Circular saw
- Brad nail gun

Cut List

Material	Part	Dimensions	Qty
1x8	Back	7 ¼" x 6"	1
1x8	Bottom	2 ¾" X 5 ¾"	1
1x8	Sides	2 ¾" X 6"	2
1x8	Front Left	5 ¼" x 6"	1
1x8	Front Right	1" x 6"	1

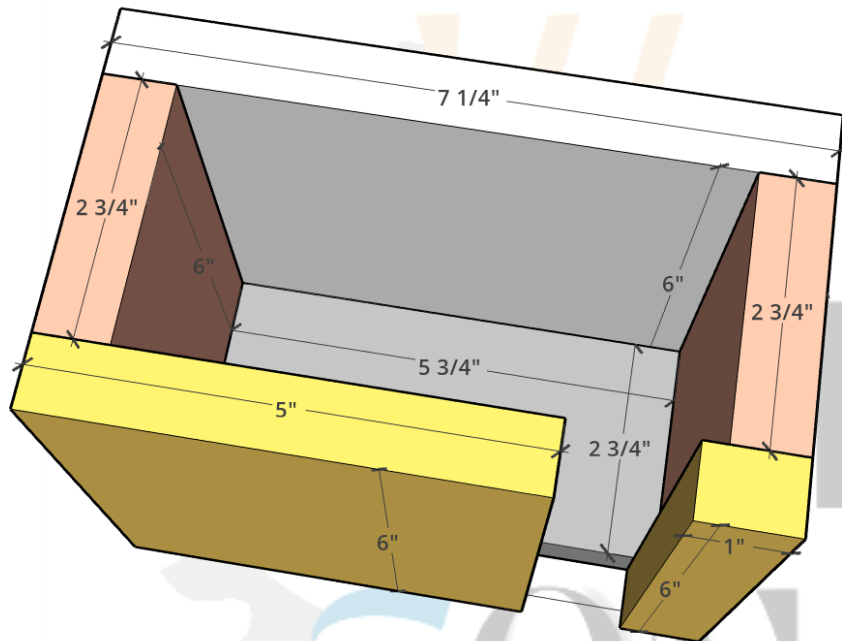

Instructions

Step 1 – Making the Cuts

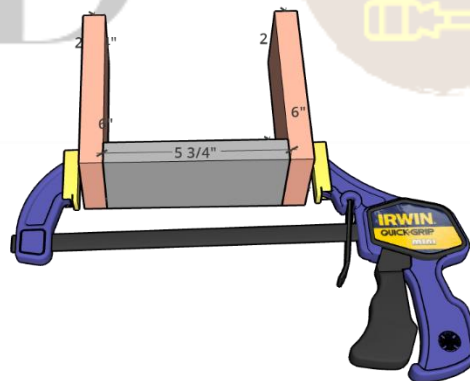
Cut the boards according to the cut list above



Step 2 – Assembly

Start by attaching the two sides to the bottom using some wood glue and brad nails. Two nails on each side should be enough.

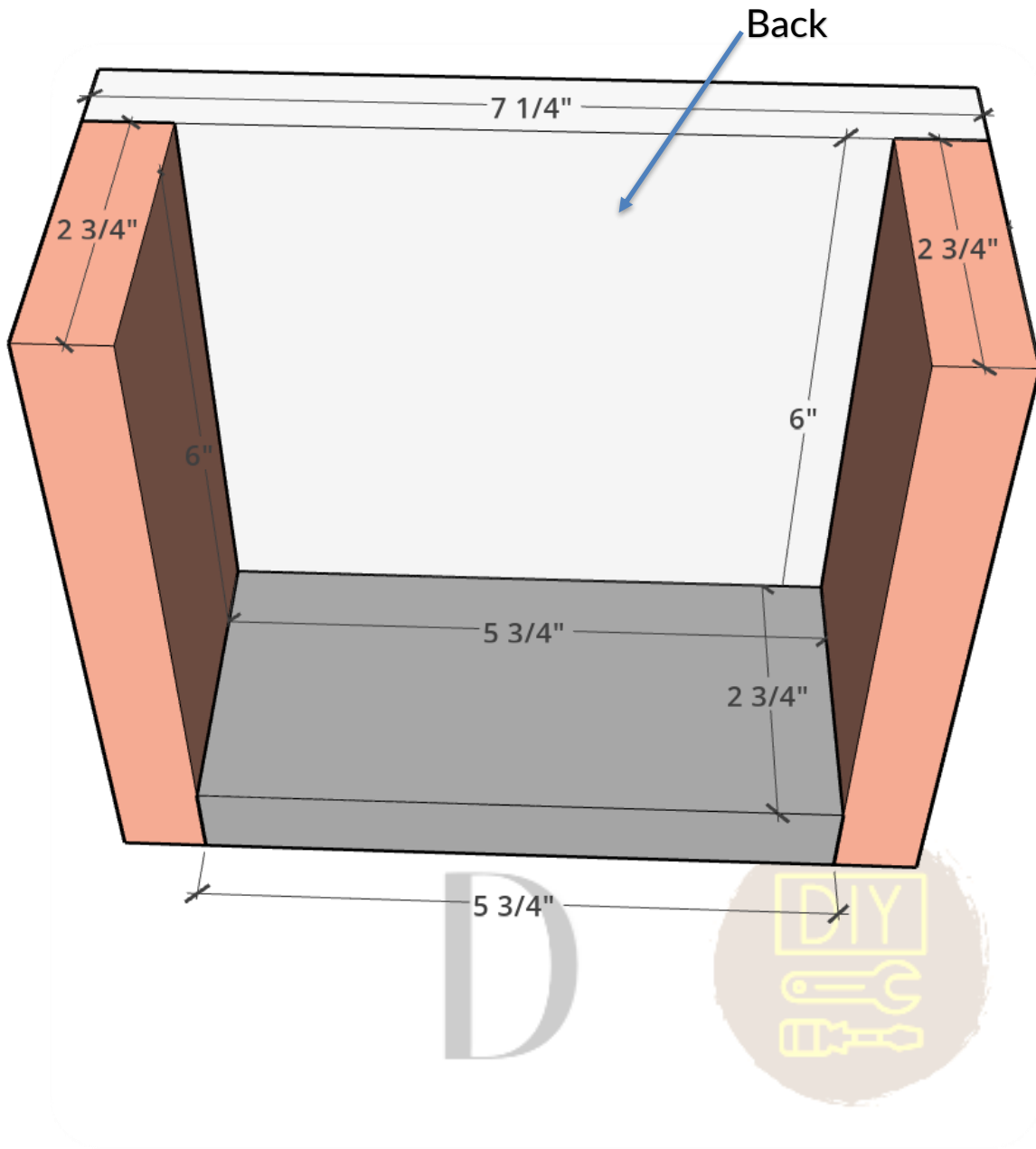
Tip: You can use a twelve-inch squeeze clamp (example shown below) to hold the two sides on to the bottom piece after you apply the wood glue. This will free up your hands so that you can fire on the brad nails to secure the boards together.



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Step 3

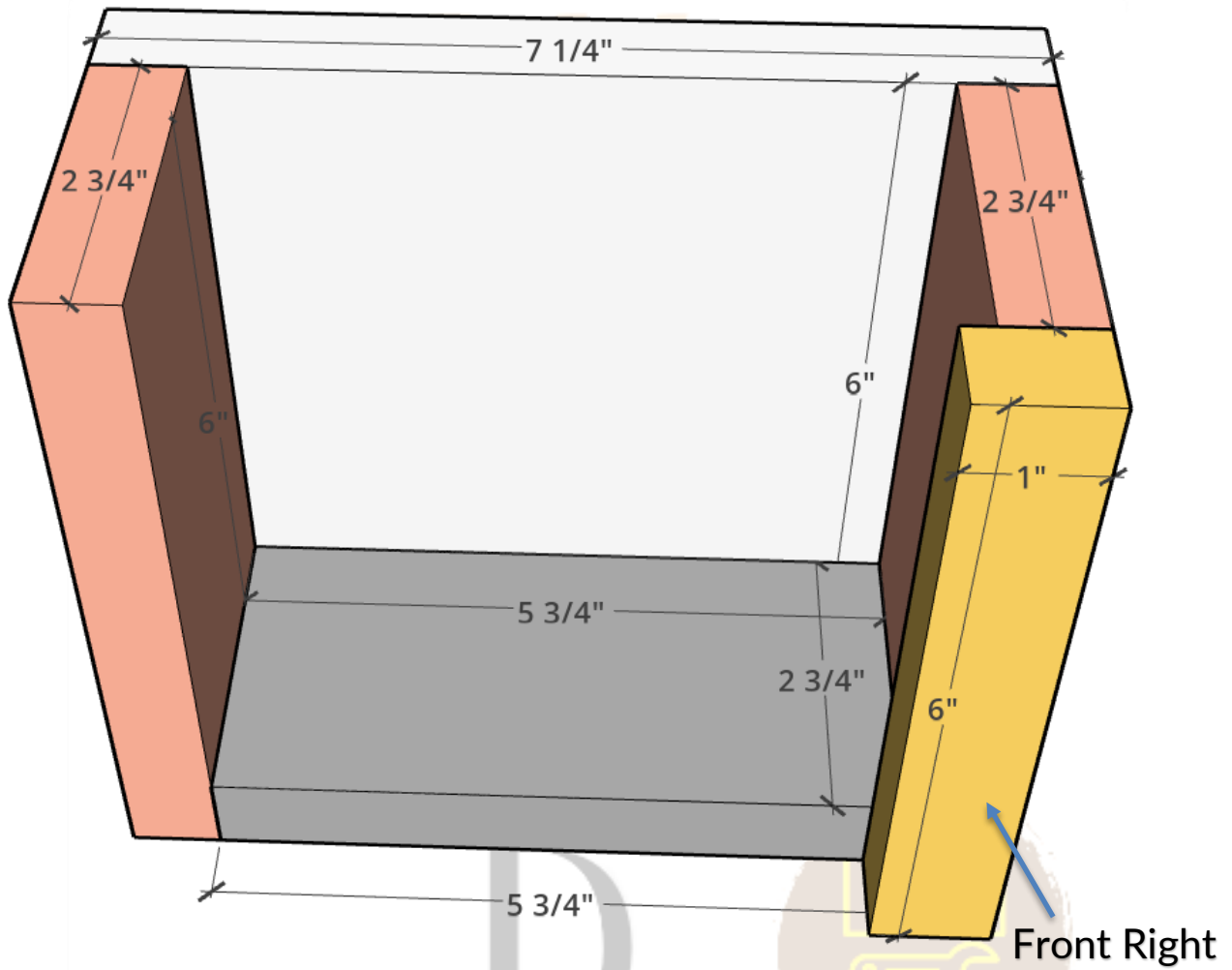
Attach the back using wood glue and brad nails. Three nails on each side should be enough.



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Step 4

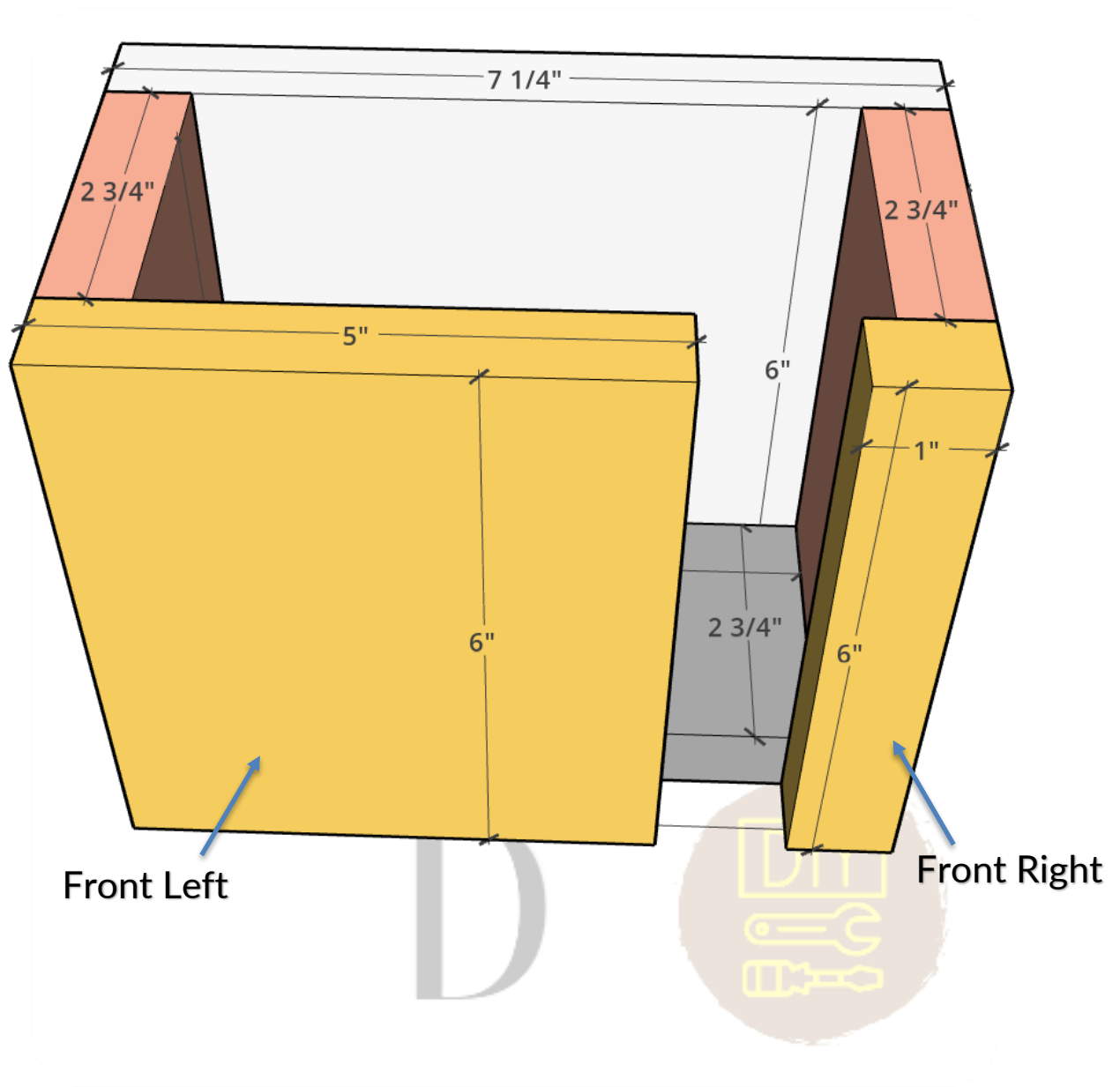
Attach the front right piece using wood glue and brad nails. Three nails on the side and one or two at the bottom should be enough.



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Step 5

Attach the front left piece using wood glue and brad nails. Three nails on the side and three at the bottom should be enough.



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Tips

- Make sure the blade on the saw that you are using is not dull. This will ensure clean cuts on the lumber.
- Finishing with stain or paint is optional, but you can definitely sand off any visible splinters sharp edges or rough spots, since that will make for smoother and safer handling.
 - Using a pre-stain will make for a better looking even coat stain
